There are so many fun things to do here!








I might have to wait in a long line for some of the attractions.

Or I can choose to sit and practice building with LEGO.






I can build a racecar...





...and use it at the Motor Test Center!




I can build my own LEGO Ninja...

I can see fireworks without it being too loud!


At the front desk, I can sign up for a class with my parent.

Sometimes, there is a friendly adult who will challenge me and other kids to build with LEGO in the Build Challenge Arena!






I can choose to get active and try the pirate ship!

I will have to squeeze through tunnels and crawl through tight spaces in the pirate ship.






I can read the rules to decide if I am comfortable taking off my shoes to play in the pirate ship.



If I am not bothered by laser lights and fog...




...I can test
